## Grade 3: Weekly Phonics Focus <br> Lesson 3

In our classroom this week, we are reviewing how to read and spell words with the vowel team syllable pattern. Here are the letters and patterns to practice this week:

| Consonants | $b, c, d, f, g, h, j, k, l, m, n, p, q, r, s, t, v, w, x, z$ $y$ at the beginning of a word |
| :---: | :---: |
| Vowels | $\begin{aligned} & a, e, i, o, u \\ & y \text { at the end of a word } \end{aligned}$ |
| Vowel Team Syllables | A vowel team has 2 or more letters side by side that are pronounced as 1 vowel sound. |
| Predictable Vowel Teams (with one sound) | The letters ee spell the /ē/sound, as in the keyword eel. The letters igh spell the /i// sound, as in the keyword night. The letters oa spell the / $\overline{/} /$ sound, as in the keyword oat. The letters oe spell the /o/s sound, as in the keyword toe. The letters ai spell the /ā/sound, as in the keyword mail. The letters ay spell the /ā/ sound, as in the keyword hay. The letters oi spell the /oi/ sound, as in the keyword oil. The letters oy spell the/oi/ sound, as in the keyword boy. The letters $a u$ spell the /aw/ sound, as in the keyword sauce. The letters aw spell the /aw/ sound, as in the keyword straw. <br> (Note: The letters $g$ and $h$ become part of a vowel team when they follow the single vowel letter $i$. The letter $w$ becomes part of a vowel team when it follows the vowel $a$.) |
| Unpredictable Vowel Teams (with more than one sound) | - The letters ea spell the /ē/ sound, as in the keyword eagle. The letters ea spell the /ĕ/ sound, as in the keyword bread. <br> - The letters ie spell the /ē/sound, as in the keyword chief. The letters ie spell the /i// sound, as in the keyword tie. <br> - The letters ow spell the /ō/ sound, as in the keyword snow. The letters ow spell the /ow/ sound, as in the keyword owl. <br> (Note: The letter $w$ becomes part of a vowel team when it follows the vowelo.) |

(Note: A letter in slashes, such as /s/, indicates that the letter sound rather than the letter name should be said.)

Here are some examples of words with the vowel team syllable pattern:

## Word Sort

Guide your child through this Word Sort . Read these steps to your child:

1. Underline the vowel letters in each word.
2. Identify the syllable type and say the vowel sound. If the vowel team is unpredictable, say both vowel sounds.
3. Read the word. If the word has an unpredictable vowel team, try reading the word with the most common sound first. If it does not make a word you know, try the other pronunciation.
4. Write the word in the correct column in the vowel team chart below.
