Grade 3: Weekly Phonics Focus Lesson 3

In our classroom this week, we are reviewing how to read and spell words with the <u>vowel team syllable</u> <u>pattern</u>. Here are the letters and patterns to practice this week:

Consonants	b, c, d, f, g, h, j, k, l, m, n, p, q, r, s, t, v, w, x, z						
	y at the beginning of a word						
Vowels	a, e, i, o, u						
	y at the end of a word						
Vowel Team	A vowel team has 2 or more letters side by side that are pronounced						
Syllables	as 1 vowel sound.						
Predictable	The letters <i>ee</i> spell the /ē/ sound, as in the keyword <i>eel</i> .						
Vowel Teams	The letters igh spell the $ightarrow \overline{i}$ sound, as in the keyword $night$.						
(with one	The letters oa spell the /ō/ sound, as in the keyword oat.						
	The letters <i>oe</i> spell the /ō/ sound, as in the keyword <i>toe</i> .						
sound)	The letters ai spell the \bar{a} sound, as in the keyword $mail$.						
	The letters ay spell the \overline{a} sound, as in the keyword hay .						
	The letters oi spell the /oi/ sound, as in the keyword oil.						
	The letters oy spell the/oi/ sound, as in the keyword boy.						
	The letters au spell the /aw/ sound, as in the keyword sauce.						
	The letters aw spell the /aw/ sound, as in the keyword straw.						
	(Note: The letters g and h become part of a vowel team when they follow the single vowel letter i . The letter w becomes part of a vowel team when it follows the vowel a .)						
Unpredictable Vowel Teams (with more than one sound)	 The letters ea spell the /ē/ sound, as in the keyword eagle. The letters ea spell the /ĕ/ sound, as in the keyword bread. The letters ie spell the /ē/ sound, as in the keyword chief. The letters ie spell the /ī/ sound, as in the keyword tie. The letters ow spell the /ō/ sound, as in the keyword snow. The letters ow spell the /ow/ sound, as in the keyword owl. (Note: The letter w becomes part of a vowel team when it follows 						
	the vowel o.)						

(**Note:** A letter in slashes, such as /s/, indicates that the letter sound rather than the letter name should be said.)

Word Sort

Guide your child through this Word Sort . Read these steps to your child:

- 1. Underline the vowel letters in each word.
- 2. Identify the syllable type and say the vowel sound. If the vowel team is unpredictable, say both vowel sounds.
- 3. Read the word. If the word has an unpredictable vowel team, try reading the word with the most common sound first. If it does not make a word you know, try the other pronunciation.
- 4. Write the word in the correct column in the vowel team chart below.
